## NATIONALISSUE

To the Membership of Region 2,

In an effort to keep all of you informed, I will outline the current governance issues facing IPA Canada Section, and the solution to the issues.

In or about 2014, the National Executive Board (NEB) decided to, for its own reasons, incorporate IPA Canada under the Canada Not For Profit Act ("the Act"). In so doing, and in an attempt to comply with the Act, the NEB changed the governance structure of IPAC by introducing a Board of Directors working in concert with a new National Executive Committee (NEC). New

Bylaws/constitution were drafted and put to the IPAC membership for a vote. Once those bylaws were "passed", the new governance structure was formed.



## NATIONALISSUE

Here lies the issue. In order for IPAC to be that new corporate entity, further, vital steps were required but never performed. These steps included the transfer of all assets held by IPAC to the new corporation as well as the transfer of all IPAC members to the new corporation. As neither of these critical transfers ever occurred, the new corporation was nothing but an empty shell with no legal position within the IPA Canada Section.

As a result, IPAC is left in a limbo until we fix the issue. The original governance structure had the NEB governing the IPAC. That NEB consisted of a National President and two other nationally elected positions as well as the Presidents of each of IPAC's regions. This was the body which, in 2014, attempted the incorporation. It was the body governing IPAC at that time. There is currently a vote being taken by the NEB, of all of the Regional Presidents in order to verify the governance format to be used. Those results will be in very shortly. For this reason, the recent by-elections for the National Board of Directors has been cancelled.



## NATIONALISSUE

To clarify that, as the IPAC Corporation has no assets and no members, it has no way of legally constructing a Board of Directors from the IPA Canada Section organization. As complicated as this may seem to most of us, these issues and resolutions are as a result of advice given to the National President, in writing, from Canada's number one law firm dealing with incorporations.

Rest assured that none of the above has any negative impact on the IPA Canada Section which has been in continual legal operation since 1961, or its Regions and members. It is simply a structural and governance issue, one which the International Executive Committee is aware of. It is in the interest of openness that I have asked this to be part of our newsletter.
